



Welcome to the Yakima Training Center's Recreational Vehicle Travel Camp Dry Park, open for military Service members and retirees with ID cards April 1–Oct. 1 each year.

This RV Park has four spaces meant for those traveling through the area or here for short-term training up to five days.

Reservations & length of stay

Reservations are accepted up to 60 days in advance. Reservations can be made by calling Yakima Training Center MWR Blanchard Fitness Center office at 509-577-3208 9 a.m.–5:30 p.m. Pacific Standard Time. The office is closed on holidays.

Customers can reserve a site for \$15 (one-night stay), which is nonrefundable. Patron will have until 11 a.m. the date of the reservation to arrive and pay for the full reservation.

If the person does not show or call by noon, the customer will be charged one night's stay and will lose the remainder of the reservation.

Overnight fees paid up front are \$15 per night up to seven nights. One renewal is allowed if space is available. Spaces are first-come, first-served. At time of reservation, patron will provide vehicle license plate information. Upon check-in, patron will provide current vehicle registration.

Check in at the Blanchard Fitness Center, Bldg. 502, to pay and receive the permit placard, which must be displayed visibly in vehicle's windshield. Return the placard at checkout. Patrons must pass the exit inspection of "no trace left behind."

Check-in is at noon and check-out is at 10 a.m. No after-hours check-ins are allowed.

Cancellation policy

Reservation will forfeit the night's deposit that was taken to hold the item. Patron will pay the fee for the duration at check-in.

Rules

Please help us create an environment worthy of your visit by following the rules.

Patron takes full responsibility and assumes all risk for their property and holds MWR and the Garrison harmless of any and all damages to self, property and vehicles.

Damage fees will be assessed and collected at check-out. Yakima Training Center police and the MWR manager/YTC police or higher command have the right to evict patrons for noncompliance.

Patrons utilizing YTC's RV Travel Camp Dry Park are expected to follow all rules set forth by Army regulation, MWR policy/rules and YTC police standards.

- Patron will back into spot and **display permit visibly** in windshield.
- All travel camp spaces shall be kept neat, clean and orderly, as determined by management. If spaces need attention, management will notify patron and/or police or higher command.
- Travel camp spaces are for one registered vehicle and one registered car. Other towed vehicles (boats, etc.) shall be stored in the paid MWR Storage Lot at \$5 per day.
- Patron shall observe quiet hours from 10 p.m.–6 a.m.
- No vehicle repairs, storage of vehicles, maintenance activities, fluid changes or washing of vehicles is permitted. Any spill must be picked up and disposed of at the Hazardous Materials yard.
- No sleeping outside vehicles.
- No fires, no firearms, no fireworks.
- All gray water shall be collected in containers and patrons are responsible for disposal of gray water off YTC.
- All children shall be supervised by patron and will not be left alone.
- All trash shall be picked up and

disposed of off base. Patron may use the waste receptacles located at the east end of Sixth or Fifth avenue. Dumpsters outside the Pacific Rim Café are for their use only.

- Profanity, intoxication and disorderly behavior will not be tolerated. Alcohol is not permitted outside the vehicles. Management and/or YTC police will enforce and escort patrons off location if necessary. Tickets and fines will occur for behavior misconduct. No refunds will be issued from MWR.
- Charcoal or propane barbecues are allowed as long as area is cleaned up after use.
- Respect and observe the speed limit.

Pets & animals

Please do not feed any native animals or encourage them into your camping site. The travel camp welcomes your pets within these guidelines:

- Your animal(s) will be kept on a leash no longer than 10 feet at all times.
- Please be sure your animal stays within your site's boundaries, unless you're walking it under your direct control.
- Owners are responsible for ensuring that pet droppings are disposed of in a trash receptacle.
- Pets cannot be left unattended when you leave the travel camp.
- Staff may impound or remove any stray or unattended animals at the owner's expense.
- Animals will be current on their vaccinations.

YTC is open to the public for hunting, bird watching, mountain biking, horseback riding, hiking, falconry, archery target range and use of the Juvenile Fishing Pond. Get your YTC Outdoor Recreation Card at Blanchard Fitness Center (Bldg. 502). For parking/storage, register at the fitness center.

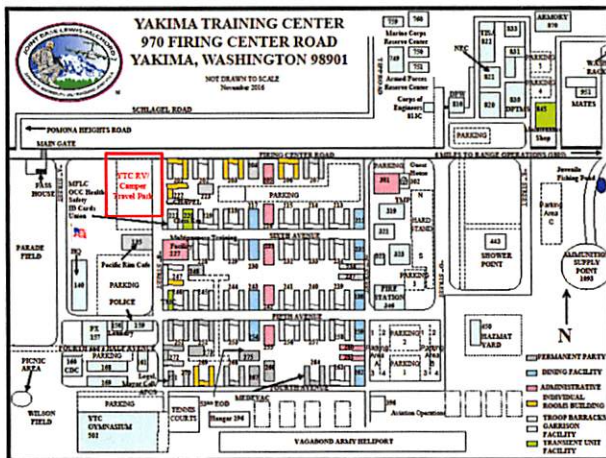
Recreational Vehicle Travel Camp Dry Park

The RV Travel Camp Dry Park is located on B Street, a large parking lot along a grassy area, north of the Pacific Rim Café.

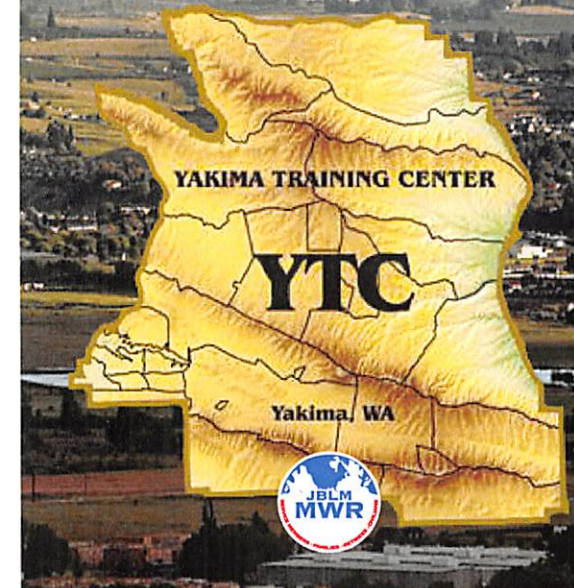
- Patron will provide a self-contained unit.
- Travel camp has no amenities: no power, no dump, no electricity, no laundry, no showers or restrooms or garbage disposal.
- No camp tents allowed.

For your convenience, the RV Travel Camp is located near these base services:

- The Pacific Rim Café with Rec Center offers free WiFi. The café is normally open 9 a.m.–8 p.m. Monday–Saturday.
- Coffee bistro to the south of the café is open 6–11 a.m.
- AAFES Exchange opens Mondays–Saturdays at 10 a.m.
- Near outdoor grills, gazebo, horse shoe pits and outdoor volleyball pit. Check out equipment at Blanchard Fitness Center (Bldg. 502).
- Gym use for ages 16 and older with ID card is 5:30 a.m.–8 p.m. weekdays and 8:30 a.m.–3:30 p.m. weekends.
- Juvenile fishing pond up Firing Center Road for youth ages 15 and younger to catch up to three fish a day May–September.
