

POLICY

- 1. HEARING and EYE PROTECTION IS MANDATORY for all shooters on the range.
- 2. By Order of the Commanding General all privately owned firearms utilized on JBLM will be registered.
- 3. No uncased guns allowed in the sale store. Guns are to remain cased until reaching the firing line.
- 4. No consumption of alcohol or alcohol is allowed prior to arriving on the range or during use of the range.
- 5. Guns will remain on table, unloaded and place on safe until instructed by the Range Officer.
- 6. Guns will be pointed down range with action open at all times.
- 7. PISTOL SHOOTERS:
 - a. NO body holstering of pistols is allowed on the range.
 - b. NO rapid firing
 - c. Unload all pistol during cease fire, and magazines will be extracted from semi-auto pistols
- 8. No shooting at frames, turn buckles, cables. Replacing equipment raises prices!!!!! Help take care of your range.
- 9. No targets will be removed without command from the Range Officer.
- 10. All personnel must wear **HEARING and EYE** protection while on the firing line.
- 11. All personnel will present an authorized military ID card and sign in: a. Authorized shooters may sponsor two non-military guests.
- b. DOD civilian and their immediate family members may utilized the range.
- 12. Command firing sequence (All shooters will adhere to the following):
- a. Shooters Stand behind and away from you table. b. Shooters with a raise of your hand – Are you ready on the left? Are you ready on the right?
- c. Shooters you may now move forward to your firing table.
- d. Range Officer will announce Is there anyone down range? Is anyone down range?
- e. Lock and load your gun.
- f. Commence firing (6-10 minute firing time; and a 6-10 minute down time).
- g. Cease-fire! Cease-Fire! CLEAR, LOCK, UNLOAD, REMOVE MAGAZINE, and **OPEN ACTION** - facing up.
- h. Stand behind and away from your table.
- i. With a show of hands Clear on the Left? Clear on the Right? Both sides are now clear. Firers, you may now check your targets. Do not **HANDLE GUN** or make any adjustment until everyone has returned from down range.
- j. Pick up all your expended brass and throw out all your trash.
- 13. There is **NO HANDLING OF GUNS** when personnel are down range.
- 14. Mangum Caliber Rifles are not authorized nor allowed on Range 15 IAW Installation Safety.
- 15. Finished Shooters:
 - a. Clean up all your trash.
 - b. Bring your target in from the range and tear off target. Return targets and stands back to the range shack.
- c. Ensure your gun is unloaded, cleared, and cased prior to departing the range. 16. VIOLATIONS AND FAILURE TO COMPLY RULES/STANDARDS:
 - a. FIRST OFFENSE: 30-Day suspension of range use privilege.
 - b. SECOND OFFENSE: Loss of Range Privileges. Must see Post Garrison Commander for reinstatement of range use.
- 17. Place all expended brass in Brass collection containers provided.
- 18. No firing in front of the shooting benches.
- 19. SHOTGUNS SLUGS ONLY!!! NO other shot size is allowed.
- 20. Children ages 7 17 may shoot provided they are closely supervised and accompanied by an adult 18 years and older.
- 21. Range is not open to shooting unless an authorized Northwest Adventure Employee is present.
