WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Contractor crews working for the Washington State Department of Transportation are widening 1-5 and building new bridge structures at Thorne Lane and Berkeley Street. On Sept. 23, crews will begin installing 481 noise wall panels adjacent to northbound 1-5 from 41st Division Drive to just west of Sycamore Lane. You are receiving this flyer because we want you to be prepared for construction noise and lights throughout this process.

WHAT TO EXPECT

During this work, crews will close the right lane of northbound I-5 from 41st Division Drive to Berkely Street, Monday through Friday from 8:30 p.m. to 4:30 a.m.

September 23 - November 19: Crews will construct noise panels north of the JBLM Main Gate towards Berkeley Street.

November 19 - January 20: Crews will construct noise panels south of the JBLM Main Gate.

Operation Clean-Up

Ongoing: JBLM Police Abandoned Vehicle Section locates and identifies abandoned and illegally parked vehicles (POVs, boats, RVs, etc.)

Upon identification, abandoned vehicles are issued a DD Form 2504 (Abandoned Vehicle Notice). Attempts to contact the owner or unit are made prior to any impoundment action. Unit CSMs are key in this process.

Operation Clean-Up Vehicle Removal:

On 15 October, vehicles that are inoperable, pose environmental hazards, or have failed attempts to contact, owners no longer assigned to JBLM, no DOL records, no registration, or expired plates, are removed from JBLM same-day.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

TRICARE Open Season is the annual period when you can enroll in or change your health plan for the next year. The 2019 TRICARE Open Season begins on Monday, November 11th and ends on Monday, December 9th.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

During TRICARE Open Season, you can:

Do nothing: You'll continue in your current health plan through 2020 or as long as you're eligible.

Enroll in a plan: If you're eligible for a **TRICARE Prime** option or **TRICARE Select** but not enrolled, you can enroll in a plan now.

Change plans: If you're already enrolled in a **TRICARE Prime** option, or **TRICARE Select**, you can *switch plans* and *switch* between individual and family enrollment.

Qualifying Life Event: A QLE is a certain change in your life, such as marriage, birth of a child, or retirement from active duty, which may mean different TRICARE options are available to you. A TRICARE QLE opens a 90-day period for you to make eligible enrollment changes. A QLE for one family member means all family members may make enrollment changes. Pro-Gear Rule

- ◆ **Not** be considered as PBP&E per Joint Travel Regulation (JTR):
 - **♦** Computers, plaques, awards and other types of mementoes memorabilia.
 - ♦ Furniture is not consider Pro-Gear.
- Member or employee responsibility to make sure Pro-Gear is annotated on inventory sheets and separated from primary household goods before Transportation Service provider has arrived to residence
- ◆ Constructive weight for Professional Books Paper and Equipment (PBP&E)
 - ◆ Pro-gear can be weigh on bathroom or platform scale
 - ◆ 7 lbs. per cubic for used when it is impossible or impractical to weigh the Pro-Gear
- ◆ Service members spouse authorize PBP&E in the amount up to 500 pounds needed for employment or community support activities.
- ◆ Service members will be restricted to a maximum limit of up to 2,000 pounds.
- ◆ Not charge against Military or Civilian employees Authorized weight allowances
