County & School Services

If you have concerns with your child's development, with or without a medical diagnosis, we recommend:

- a) Developmental Screening through your county's Birth to Three Early Intervention Services, (Child: Birth to 3rd Birthday). Contact: PierceCountyWA.gov/EI or Thurston's SSP2P.org/Early-Intervention
- b) Special Education Evaluation through your school (For a Child, 3rd Birthday to 12th grade). Contact: your school principal and psychologist by email/written request.

As you know, being your child's best advocate is coordinating care and effective communication. We recommend sharing information between providers, schools, an agencies so through your efforts we are all on the same page in meeting your family's goals in long term health and well-being.
